### 3) PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- a. We have received 51 responses to our SPC Parent Survey. SPC will process the results and prepare final report for next PAC meeting

- c. Student Recognition There's a staff committee struck to look at options. Some ideas that were discussed include:
  - Great to recognize kids for their achievements academically, sports, fine arts, and for kids who go above and beyond to help or mentor other students. Seeing peers receiving recognition may promote goal setting for other students "...next year I want to be the one who wins that...." Maybe a 70's, 80's and 90's "Club" where students are recognized at all levels, not just the top one or two.
  - An assembly at the beginning of year to explain what categories students can be recognized for may prompt some students to plan for (set goals) to achieve an award.
  - A big celebration at the end of the year to recognize these kids is best. Many parents were disappointed to learn that kids are taken out of class and congratulated but without their peers partaking in their celebration. Open the celebration to the public, so the community can see our students.
  - Include in the Town Hall meetings a few questions around what kids want to be recognized for, and how they'd like to be recognized: plaque, certificate, money, etc.
