• Louise Pool is a Health Promoting Schools Coordinator and her job is to bring healthy programs and awareness to schools, students and families.

• Allison Bell – Chef in Invermere has been commissioned to talk about healthy food choices in schools.

• The Breakfast for Learning program is being funded by Loblaw's and other major charities

• Application for this program is in June 2012

• Outside support from parents and businesses is being sought. Evergreen, parents and the Rotary Club will be approached for support.

• The support from the community is needed to make this program happen.

• There is opportunity to work with MSS Support staff and there are many students on the IEP program. With these students in difficult situations at home, this translates to poor starts in the mornings and coming to school with no lunches.

• Issue is becoming prevalent as students are not as "awake" during school hours. This is the main reason this program is being brought forward.

• Options for the Breakfast part: breakfast burritos, fruit, yogurt, bagels.... any other suggestions are welcome.

• Application request to PAC for \$1,000 – this fund is needed to jump start the program, start a tracking system to see how many students are in need of this program and other expenditures to make this program run.
