10) SLOCAN VALLEY FACILITIES PLANNING

- Meeting held Dec 7, 2010 at Brent Kennedy Elementary. Barb, Glen and Susan Wilson were present
- 4 recommendations were made:

 - 2. That the Board of Education support the development of a family of schools working together on behalf of all learners in the Slocan Valley
 - 3. That the Board of Education support the further development of student access to learning in a hybrid on-line and face-to-face environment in the Slocan Valley, in a next generation learning environment
 - 4. That the Board of Education commit to examine east and west catchment boundaries for schools in the Slocan Valley.

13) LIBRARY COLLABERATION

- The school district is looking at collaboration between school and municipal libraries for ease of sharing resources.
- Library Referendum results for Area H was positive, so residents can now go to Nelson Library for their free library card. People need photo ID and documentation showing proof of residence.

14) TECNOLOGY SURVEY

- 70 parents responded to the survey
- Survey indicates positive response from parents in regards to technology with some reservations about physical interaction and equal access to equipment.
- Basic questions have come up regarding "old school" reading, writing and arithmetic.
 Other questions around, affordability, access and distractions to students was discussed. Also discussed was parents' view of "distraction" and students may be very different students can multi-task at a very high rate (Facebook, iPod and homework all at the same time)
- Today's students are the BRIDGE GENERATION of "old school teaching" and "new age technology." Tech Committee's next steps will be to look at bridging the gap between old and new technology.
