- Used web-based ticket publishing software to create the tickets. Saved time numbering each ticket and stub by hand.
- o Advertised in the Pennywise and had a few local residents order plants
- Placed a poster in the staff room for staff orders only one order came from that.
 Students were good at asking staff to buy plants

IDEAS FOR NEXT YEAR:

- Keep better track of plants being picked up two people gave ticket stubs that hadn't been paid for.
- Count white and pink plants before Georama leaves. It appears we were shorted two white plants
- o Poinsettia information on web site and expand advertising to Valley Voice and Express
- Stapling booklets so we can see the ticket number through the baggie easier to record numbers
