1. WELCOME CALL TO ORDER/ADDITIONS TO AGENDA

## 3. INTERACT CLUB

- Kathy Knapik introduced the newly formed "Interact Club" who successfully spearheaded a project to install a new water dispenser by the gym. This group is affiliated with the Rotary Club in Nelson and is beginning community service in the area. The group will be heading to Mexico to continue their humanitarian work and will be holding various fund raising activities at the school.

4. PRINCIPAL \& VICE PRINCIPAL REPORTS

- New Staff - Lauren Everall (Art program), Danny Leeming (Law 12), Laurie Meers (Secretary), Tony Applebee (Aboriginal Ed.)
- Gary Anaka - "The Teenage Brain" seminar was a great turnout with approx. 140 people attending. This event was funded in part by the RDCK with future plans to have Gary return
- ERASE Bullying Strategy - Staff from Mt. Sentinel attended the first round of training sessions in Castlegar joining staff from all four local school districts: Kootenay Lake, Kootenay-Columbia, Boundary and Arrow Lakes. This initiative is a 5 -year violence risk assessment strategy for all schools in the province. The idea behind this is schools will establish a relationship with local policy, health care providers, ministry departments, etc. to be able to identify and defuse potentially violent situations involving students.
- Hot Lunch Forms - online ordering is still being worked on due to unforseen issues. Food has been well received from various reports. Most hot lunches being serviced on 2nd Nutrition Break.
- Hot Breakfast - Tuesday \& Thursdays and currently hot "mcmuffins" are being sold for $\$ 2.50$ each. Group is looking at providing healthy snacks Monday/Friday
- Tutoring with Dave Steele is available in mornings and after school on Mondays for students needing help with their work. Columbia Basin Alliance for Literacy (CBAL) is financially supporting this activity.

## 13. INTERMEDIATE CLASS (GR. 7\&8)

- Blair D'Andrea \& Shellie Maloff shared information about how the concept of multi-aged learning is beneficial to students at all grade levels and age groups.
- Multi-aged learning is not a new concept is operating very successfully around the province.
- The Intermediate Class will not have traditional letter grades but will be assessed on what they know, their work habits, etc. Parents can contact their child's teacher for a letter grade if they wish.
- There were concerns brought up about some Grade 8 students not feeling challenged enough while some Grade 7 students are overwhelmed with the new timetable. Parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher directly with any concerns.


## 14. NUTRITION BREAKS

- Discussed the 35 -minute breaks are not enough for students to rest and eat a proper lunch nor is it long enough to get extra help from teachers.
- Staff shared that, when asked, the majority of students liked this format rather than a full hour break.


## 15. SPORT TEAM FEES

- There is some confusion around the reimbursement of expenses when parents drive students to and from sporting events.
- Discussed the need for parents to have a breakdown of extra-curricular fees paid so parents know where their money is being spent.
