3. PRINCIPAL & VICE PRINCIPAL REPORTS

Glen and Blair send their regrets. The following was submitted by Glen:

- **SUMMER PRO-D:** Full attendance by a highly professional staff who were engaged in developing their profession with self-directed growth plans
- SCHOOL START-UP: Enrolment up 382 students so far. New staff Cory Scott -Mech/Tech/Math, Brian Simpson - Math, Debra Soke - Head Secretary and Marj Jmaeff -EA
- SPORTS DAY PARTICIPATION: was great by all students and staff
- **TECHNOLOGY:** It continues to be leading edge of District because of Tamara Malloff's work.
- **IMPACT of TEACHER JOB ACTION:** Minimal at this point because of the nature of the school staff as compared to what we have heard elsewhere.
- **EXTRA-CURRICULARS:** They will continue to roll out at MSSS as per usual
- **RENOVATIONS:** Renovations to the gym change rooms nearing completion, no more lockers as they were in bad disrepair. More benches and clothes hooks. **PARKING AREA** repaved due to summer damage.
- **STUDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM**: is transitioning over to BCeSIS.
- **MIKE MALAKOFF:** off on extended Medical Leave but will hopefully be back by mid-November.

DISCUSSION ON PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

- "Student management system" is the program used by the school to track student information including grades.
- Teachers will not be preparing report cards except for Grade 12
- Open house slated for October 5 is cancelled due to job action. Parents can and should contact teachers directly with questions. Teachers will contact parents with any concerns they have about a student.
