- There is a Connect Program running at Mt. Sentinel on Wednedays
- The GAGE program has changed this year. In the past, students were isolated from peers. They are not being integrated into the proper classroom. The program now welcomes Facilitated Learning students who are working at their own pace, or on a distributed learning program. There are still some adjustments being made, but the school is committed to this format.
