### Reports – Trustee Report

- Budget
  - Budget cuts are now expected and review of recommendations are being done
  - 5 FTE layoffs anticipated due to the lowering of student enrolment numbers (155 less students)
  - Clerical issues are being reviewed. It seems that there is a misunderstanding that there is no issue
    due to lack of complaints, yet there seems to issues. Monies geared for clerical are now being
    targeted for budget cuts or to be diverted to other areas
  - Survey is out and is due April 19 for finance committee regarding the budget
  - Capacity at the Winlaw Elementary school is being discussed
  - The Creston ridership is still an ongoing issued that is also on the table for discussion

#### Freedom Quest Presentation on Marijuana

- Focus on "Harm Reduction" solutions in teaching young people and old alike to seek choices on how to reduce the risk of use.
- Discussion surrounding marijuana use on topics from medicinal use to addiction. What are the pros and cons of each
- Concerns of the methods of use of marijuana and how they can be hidden: mixing of drugs, use with tobacco (commonly known as rocker tokes – promotes huge rush in combination of nicotine), use of large amounts, driving while under the influence of marijuana, social concerns, moods & how you feel, suffering mental health issues
- THC levels in today's marijuana is much higher and more potent. This has risen dramatically in the last 20 years. This leads to higher incidences of addiction and health issues/concerns
- 1970's THC levels approx. 3 4%..... today 18.5%
- NOTE: The Kootenays is known as the HIGHEST USE in all of Canada!
